Chair of the Defence Commission 2017-2019. Minister and Head of the Ministry of Defence 1997-2002. Speaker of the Riksdag 2002-2006.

Her Majesty's Ambassador to Sweden, since 2019; Ambassador to Ukraine 2015-19; Ambassador to Georgia 2010-12.



#### Dr. Laima Liucija Andrikienė

Chair of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the Parliament of Lithuania. Member of the Committee on European Affairs of the Parliament of Lithuania. Vice-Chair of the Committee on Political Affairs and Democracy of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe. Member of the European Parliament (2004-2014, 2016-2019). Signatory to the Act of Independence of Lithuania (11 March 1990).



#### **Marko Mihkelson**

Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Estonian Parliament (Riigikogu). He has worked as director of the Baltic Centre of Russian Studies, as editor-in-chief, Moscow correspondent and foreign news editor of the daily Postimees.



#### **Alexandra Ivanov**

Speechwriter and advisor on European Affairs to the leader of the Swedish Moderate Party. She has worked as an advisor in the European Parliament and as an editorial writer in the Swedish daily newspaper Svenska Dagbladet.



#### Marcus Kolga

The founder and director of DisinfoWatch and a senior fellow at the Macdonald-Laurier and CDA institutes. He is a journalist, filmmaker, digital communications developer and human rights activist. He led the Canadian civil society campaign for Magnitsky legislation and continues to advocate for global human rights and democracy activists. He was named to The Kremlin's sanctions blacklist in March 2022.

Swedish award winning journalist, writer and security expert. Senior fellow at Stockholm Freeworld Forum, and is associated with the Swedish Defence University. He is also a member of Royal Swedish Academy of War Sciences and Royal Swedish Societies of Naval Sciences.

Finnish journalist working for Finland's public service broadcaster Yle and an author of a non-fiction book, Putin's Trolls. In September 2014, she began to investigate pro-Russian Internet trolls and became a victim of their activities.

Journalist and non-resident fellow at the Atlantic Council. She has published in the Washington Post, the Economist, Deutsche Welle, and worked as a correspondent for RFE/RL and the only independent Belarusian channel Belsat TV.
